Scholarship and Financial Aid policies apply to Off-Campus Study Programs (not including Philadelphia Center) that take place during the Fall and Spring semesters of the academic year

Scholarship and Financial Aid resources are limited for Summer Off-Campus Study Programs



Seventy Five Percent of an Academic Scholarship will apply to the cost of an approved Off-Campus Study Program, including:

Distinguished Albion Scholars Program (DSP,DAP)

Trustee Scholarships

Presidential Scholarships

Webster Scholarships

Briton Awards

Other Base Level Academic Scholarships (Klungness, Lomas)



Off-Campus Programs Grants are available to assist with the reduction to the academic scholarships

Up to \$1,500

Must demonstrate financial need through FAFSA

All talent based scholarships or awards of circumstance will apply in full to the cost of an approved Off-Campus Study Program, including:




Financial Aid Budgets

Since the cost of your Off-Campus Study Program will be equal to, or greater than, the cost of a semester on-campus, your financial aid budget will not be reduced when you study off-campus. This will allow you to apply for educational loans to cover up to the full cost of the program that is not covered by other scholarships and financial aid.

Additional Resources

If your **Direct Educational Expenses** (e.g. tuition, room, board, travel) will be greater than the cost of a regular semester at Albion, you may be eligible to receive additional loan funds to assist with these costs.

Loan Application

If you plan to apply for a Federal Direct Loan to assist with the cost of your program, be sure that you have accepted your loan in ACIS prior to your departure.

First Time Borrowers

If this will be the first time that you have borrowed under the Federal Direct Loan Program, you must complete the following steps before your departure:

- 1. Complete a Master Promissory Note
- 2. Complete Entrance Counseling

Private Alternative Loans

If you plan to apply for a Private Alternative Loan (e.g. Discover Loan, Sallie Mae Loan, Wells Fargo Loan) to assist with the cost of your program, be sure that you have submitted the loan applications to your lender before your departure.

Power of Attorney Forms

If your lender (or private scholarship donor) sends your funds via a hard copy check, you should designate a Power of Attorney to endorse your check while you are off-campus.

Important Reminder

If you will be off-campus during the spring semester, be sure that you still meet the March 1^{st} Deadline for filing your FAFSA for next year.
